


What is Anthropology?

- The study of humankind across time and geography.
- Anthropology at UCF seeks to advance anthropological concepts through teaching and research by actively investigating relevant questions of todays world.
- Course of study covers all subdisciplines:
 - Archaeology*
 - Cultural & Medical Anthropology*
 - Biological Anthropology*
 - Linguistic Anthropology
 - Public & Applied Anthropology





Anthropology at UCF

- On-Campus Degree Program
 - Methods & Practice Track
 - General Track
 - Campus students take a combination of face-to-face, hybrid, and online courses to complete their degree.
- Online Degree Program through UCF Online
 - UCF Online students only take courses online to complete their degree.



Anthropology at UCF Methods & Practice track (45 credit hours)

- Five core courses in the subdisciplines including linguistics, archaeology, cultural anthropology, and biological anthropology;
 - 3 core lower-level courses and 2 core upper-level courses
- One anthropological methods course from the cultural, archaeological or biological subfields;
- One applied, field, or lab method course;
- One high-impact learning experience high-impact learning experience course (e.g., internship, field school, study abroad, honors undergraduate thesis, or directed research);
- Seven restricted electives.



Anthropology at UCF General track (45 credit hours)

- Seven core courses in the subdisciplines including linguistics, archaeology, cultural anthropology, and biological anthropology;
 - 3 core lower-level courses and 4 core upper-level courses
- One area study course;
- Seven restricted electives.

The General and Online tracks require the same core courses; however, the General Track for on-campus students has the option to take courses on campus **and online.



Anthropology at UCF Course Offerings include (but not limited to):

- Lab-based courses: flintknapping, ceramics, primatology, osteology, human evolution, paleoethnobotany
- High-Impact courses: internships, study abroad, and field schools
- Area Studies courses: North America, Latin America, Middle East, SE Asia, Eastern Mediterranean, etc.
- Methods-based courses: ethnographic methods, archaeology methods, GIS, quantitative methods, digital anthropology
- Applied courses: public anthropology, forensic anthropology, professional archaeology



Anthropology at UCF High-Impact Learning Experiences

- The Methods & Practice track requires 3 credit hours of a High-Impact Learning experience.
- High-Impact Learning courses include study abroad programs, anthropological field schools, internships, Honors Undergraduate Thesis (HUT), directed research, and the Careers Applying Anthropology course.
- Students in the General track are not required to complete a high-impact course however they can apply 3 credit hours towards the restricted elective requirement.



Anthropology at UCF High-Impact Learning Experiences

- Our High-Impact Learning courses include:
 - Archaeology in the Caribbean (summer A)
 - Archaeology in Turkey (summer C)
 - Archaeology in the Ocala National Forest, FL (summer A)
 - Archaeological internship at Cape Canaveral, FL (spring)
 - Bioarchaeology in Croatia (summer A)
 - Cultural/Medical Anthropology internship in Peru (fall, spring)
 - Editorial Assistant internship for the Reviews Editor of the *Journal of Latin American and Caribbean Anthropology* (as needed)
- Students may also choose to complete an internship, study abroad, or field school outside of UCF. Speak with your advisor on how this works.
- Honors thesis, directed research, and other internships are also high-impact learning courses



Anthropology at UCF Research Labs

- Our faculty maintain 8 research facilities (more labs are coming!)

 - Forensic Anthropology Lab
 - Geophysical Lab
 - Interdisciplinary Geospatial Science Lab
 - Latin American and Caribbean Archaeology Lab
 - Lithic & Ceramic Analysis Archaeology Lab
 - Paleoethnobotany Archaeology Lab
 - The UCF Laboratory for Bioarchaeological Sciences
