COURSE GOALS AND DESCRIPTION: This is a proof intensive course that will cover topics related to vector spaces, subspaces, linear transformations, matrices, eigenvalues and eigenvectors, Jordan forms, inner product spaces, positive-definite, self-adjoint, unitary and normal endomorphisms (operators, matrices), bilinear and quadratic forms, etc. The goal of this course is to learn more advanced topics in linear algebra and matrix theory and to train and improve mathematical thinking and writing skills.

COURSE GRADE:

- **Homework** (15 pts × (5-1) = **60** pts): There will be five homework assignments. The lowest homework grade will be dropped.
- Exams (60 pts × 2 = 120 pts): There will be two exams. All exam grades will count toward final course grade. There will be NO make-up exams.
- Final Exam (90 pts): The final exam is cumulative.
- Projects: (30 pts): details to be announced in class.
- The TOTAL possible points of this course will be 300. Course grades will be awarded according to the following grading scale.

CALCULATORS: Calculators are NOT allowed.
