THE AMERICAN EXPERIENCE IN SAUDI ARABIA

The Prince Mohammad Bin Fahd Program for Strategic Research and Studies (PMBF Program) at the University of Central Florida (UCF) is proud to announce the first installment of the oral history project entitled "The American Experience in Saudi Arabia."

This exciting new initiative features a series of in-depth interviews, primarily with individuals now residing in Florida who previously worked for Saudi Aramco. These individuals lived and worked in the Kingdom during times of profound social, economic and political change. The PMBF Program intends for this to be an



ongoing project, and will maintain a website database of these historically significant interviews.

The first posted video features Martin and Rosemary Levine, who lived and worked in Saudi Arabia from 1981 to 1992, a time period in which the Kingdom underwent many significant changes. This interview, conducted by PMBF Director David Dumke, documents their memories of the Kingdom and gives a fresh perspective on life in the region during the reign of King Fahd.

2014 INTERFAITH FORUM

Promoting Understanding on the International, National, and Local Level

The PMBF Program hosted the 2014 UCF Interfaith Forum on October 16, 2014. Guest speakers representing the Muslim, Christian, Hindu and Sikh faiths discussed interfaith understanding and dialogue. U.N. High Representative for the Alliance of Civilizations H.E. Nassir Abdulaziz Al-Nasser, was the luncheon keynote speaker, while U.S. Deputy Special Envoy to the Organization of Islamic Cooperation Arsalan Suleman was the breakfast keynote speaker. A distinguished panel featuring local religious leaders including Imam Muhammad Musri, The Reverend Bryan G. Fulwider, Abhinav Dwivedi and Nav Khalsa also participated in the forum. Interfaith understanding is a key component of the PMBF Program. It is notable that King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz al Saud has been a global leader in encouraging interfaith dialog and understanding.

PMBF Program Takes Part in ARAMCO Annuitants Event

Director of the PMBF Program and Middle East expert, David Dumke, participated in the Aramco Annuitants Reunion in Asheville, North Carolina, from September 5 to 7, 2014. While at the conference, Dumke gave a speech about the program, its partners and the importance of U.S.-Saudi cooperation on education and culture. He also interviewed many retired Aramcons, including the first pilot for King Abdulaziz and Hugh Renfro (pictured right), who lived in the Kingdom for decades and more recently was Creative Director for the acclaimed documentary film *Arabia*.



<u>Georgia Tech's Rubin Visits Orlando</u>

Dr. Lawrence Rubin, Assistant Professor at the Sam Nunn School of International Affairs at the Georgia Institute of Technology and a faculty affiliate of the Center for International Strategy, Technology and Policy, visited UCF on September 18, 2014. Rubin is an expert on Islam and politics, Arab foreign policies and nuclear proliferation. He has conducted extensive research in the Gulf, North Africa and the Levant. While in Orlando, Rubin had a luncheon with faculty and students, gave guest lectures at both UCF and Rollins College, and was featured on WUCF TV's Global Perspectives. He also spoke about his most recent book, Islam in the Balance: Ideational Threats in Arab Politics (Stanford University

Press, 2014), discussing the gravity of ideological challenges and threats in the Middle East region, particularly in Saudi Arabia and Egypt.

FUE's President Visits UCF

The President of Future University Egypt (FUE), Dr. Ebada Sarhan, visited UCF in late September to further relationships between the two universities. Sarhan met with faculty, staff and community leaders. His visit included a tour of the UCF College of Medicine and a meeting with its dean, Dr. Deborah German. Sarhan was accompanied by Dr. Alia Abdel Fattah, who is spearheading efforts to create a FUE medical school.
