___ **Thesis Option.** Students taking the thesis option are required to complete 15 hours of elective credits, a public Thesis Prospectus Defense, and public Final Thesis Defense.

___ **Non-thesis Option.** Students taking the capstone paper option are required to complete 21 hours of elective credits, a Non-Thesis Proposal Approval Form, and a public Final Non-Thesis Defense.

Elective Courses. The program of study must include at least 33 credit hours of post-baccalaureate, graduate course work. At least 24 semester hours must be actual coursework (core and elective courses or independent study) earned exclusive of thesis and research. No course can serve as both core and elective, but additional seminar courses can be credited as an elective. Program graduate courses can be viewed in the Graduate Catalog. These courses require submission of a course syllabus to the program assistant in order for them to count towards the degree.
