The two monographs and the edited book are published with a university press, the gold standard of publishing in American sociology due to prestige and rigor of peer review. Furthermore, my most recent monograph, *Original Sin?*, is published in the prestigious Race and Ethnicity book series with the University of Georgia Press, which is edited by top scholars in my area. My textbook is published with Routledge, one of the top academic presses in the social sciences and beyond. I would also like to highlight that my edited volume includes work from some of the top scholars in my area, Eduardo Bonilla-Silva and Chip Gallagher.
