MASTER'S ALONG THE WAY

STEP 1: FORMAL COURSEWORK COMPLETION

Complete Required Coursework

SYA 5625: Proseminar

SYA 6126: Social Theory

Select Any 2 of the Following

SYA 6305: Quantitative Social Research Methods

SYA 6315: Qualitative Research Methods

SYA 6455: Research Analysis

Find an advisor early on so that they can help guide you through the program!

STEP 2: MA FINAL PRODUCT COMMITTEE FORMATION

- Choose a committee chair, and work with them to choose members of your advisory committee
- Submit the MA Final Product committee request

Prior to enrolling in SYA 6507: Academic Writing in Sociology and SYA 6909: Research Report, you must form an advisory committee.

STEP 3: MA FINAL PRODUCT & ADDITIONAL COURSEWORK CREDIT HOURS

- SYA 6507: Academic Writing in Sociology
- SYA 6909: Research Report (3 credit hours)

Complete an additional 12 credits of cour	sework

You may use courses from the Master's along the way to check off courses for the PhD coursework.

STEP 4: FINAL DEFENSE & GRADUATION

- You must apply for graduation and defend your MA Final Product
- Notify the Graduate Admissions Coordinator that your MA Final Product is complete!

STEP 1: FORMAL COURSEWORK COMPLETION

STEP 2: QUALIFYING EXAM

- Email the Graduate Director the semester before you plan to take the exam, to let them know you would like to be added to the exam in the upcoming semester
- Pass your Qualifying Exam

The exam is offered at the beginning of Fall and Spring semesters.

Once you pass the exam, you are eligible to defend your dissertation proposal. You MUST finish Step 1 before moving to Step 2!

STEP 3: DISSERTATION COMMITTEE FORMATION

- Choose a committee chair, and work with them to choose members of your advisory committee
- Dissertation committees must have one Chair, two
 Department members, and one member outside of the
 Department
- Register for the Dissertation Webcourse Link found <u>here</u>
- Complete the Intsitutional Review Board (IRB) and Human Research Protection Program (HRPP) webcourse training Link found here.
- Submit the <u>Dissertation Committee Request form</u>.

This must be completed the semester before you plan to defend your proposal!

STEP 4: COMPLETE CITI/ACADEMIC INTEGRITY TRAINING

- Complete <u>CITI Responsible Conduct of Research Training</u>
- Complete two <u>CORE Academic Integrity workshops</u>
- Complete two <u>ELECTIVE Academic Integrity workshops</u>

Before you can defend your proposal and advance to candidacy, you MUST complete these trainings!

STEP 5: DEFEND PROPOSAL (CANDIDACY EXAM)

- Work with your committee to schedule your proposal (you may enroll in SYA 7919 Doctoral Research hours the semester of your proposal defense)
- Email socadmissions@ucf.edu to let them know the time & date of the defense
- Once the proposal defense is complete, notify the Graduate Admissions coordinator, so they can begin the approval form

You can only begin this step once you have passed your qualifying exam, formed your committee, and completed all your training

STEP 6: ENROLL IN DISSERTATION HOURS

Complete the <u>Restricted Registration Agreement</u> to enroll in dissertation hours

You can enroll in Dissertation Hours the semester after have you defended your proposal. You need a total of 15 dissertation hours by the end of the program. Three hours is considered full-time, but you can enroll in up to nine per semester if you want to complete all your hours in 2-3 semesters

STEP 7: IRB APPROVAL

Submit your protocol through Huron to the Institutional Review Board for approval if your research involves human subjects <u>OR</u> have your dissertation committee chair write an email to socadmissions@ucf.edu if you research does not involve any human subjects/data/specimens.

STEP 8: FINAL DEFENSE & GRADUATION

Apply for graduation and defend your final dissertation. Refer here for step-by-step instructions.

IMPORTANT:

Refer to the <u>Academic Calendar</u> for more information about the deadlines. Make sure you select the correct term on the calendar, e.g. Summer deadlines will be on the Summer calendar, etc. These deadlines change each semester. Note that it is the student's responsibility to be aware of all deadlines and requirements. Missing a deadline can result in a delay in graduation, as CGS will not grant an extension to posted deadlines.
