Administrative Responsibilities and Accomplishments

Department Chair (1996-2011)

Primary responsibilities included budget management, oversight of degree programs, faculty and staff evaluation, faculty and staff hiring, tenure and promotion decisions, department representative to higher administration and other departments inside and outside the college, and program development.

- Developed and implemented a Ph.D. degree in Sociology beginning AY2005-06. The program has 37 students as of Fall 2016 and has awarded 51 degrees through Fall 2016.
- Oversaw the separation of Anthropology into an independent department from Sociology in January 2007. The separation was amicable and made feasible by significant growth in both disciplines.

- Developed a M.A. degree in Anthropology implemented in AY2007-08 after Anthropology had become a separate discipline.
- Developed and implemented a variable teaching load policy in the Department of Sociology that was unanimously approved by the faculty. Sociology was the first department in the College of Sciences to have an officially approved variable teaching load policy.
- Established a 16 station graduate student computer lab for the Department of Sociology. The maintenance of the lab is totally funded by student fees.
- Increased the number of full-time faculty in Sociology faculty from seven in AY1995-96 to 21 in AY2011-12.
- Established the B.A. degree in Sociology at the Daytona and Cocoa Regional Campuses and the M.A. degree in Sociology at the Cocoa Regional Campus.
- Acquired the Institute for Social and Behavioral Sciences (ISBS) from the Department of Psychology. The ISBS currently does about \$300K in research contracts annually. Previously, it had not achieved over \$50K in research contracts in a single year.
- Established a Graduate Certificate in Domestic Violence in 1998. This was the first graduate certificate program approved at the University of Central Florida. It was later transformed into a track within the MA degree in Applied Sociology.
- Acquired an interdisciplinary B.S. degree in Social Science from Interdisciplinary Studies. Degree requirements were restructured and enrollment increased by approximately 25 percent.
- Increased the number of sociology undergraduate majors by 112% during the five years from Fall 2006 to Fall 2011.
- Received the “The SWS Seal of Approval for Gender Equity” for the Department from Sociologists for Women in Society in 2008.

Interim Associate Dean (2000-2001)

Primary responsibilities included oversight of graduate programs and research, program development, assessment of all college programs, and management of the overhead budget.
